Main Message - Paul's letter to the Romans is as valid today as it has ever been.

I will be taking us on an expository journey through the book of Romans and it will take as long as it takes. Chapter 1 vs 1 -17 Setting the stage Chapter 1 vs 18 – 32 Calling out sin in the world --- Week 2

Chapter 2 – 2.5 God's Holiness is expressed in all creation, his love, his law and HIS WRATH!

Chapter 2.5 - 3. God is no respecter of persons. His law should be written on your heart and that you do the things of the law. Knowing it, hearing it are of little value if you don't do it. Ignoring it also doesn't make it go away.

Chapter 3 - ? – Paul really drives the point home, using scripture from both the Psalms and Isaiah to give this one vital understanding. It is meant to break the Spirit of anyone willing to accept the fact they are flawed and would have no standing before God if it were not for Jesus. You may ask, Why am I doing this when we are all believers in God. Because it is not just about your belief. People create beliefs all the time. That does not make them true. The world these days has people believing that boys can be girls through their belief. That you can be justified in stealing because you are impoverished. That we can all get along and we don't need God with all of his laws and requirements. These are lies. Those who like to be deceived believe these things. What is faith then? Faith puts trust in something else other than what you believe. But lets look at what Paul tells us starting in Romans 3. This is the Romans Road to Salvation.
